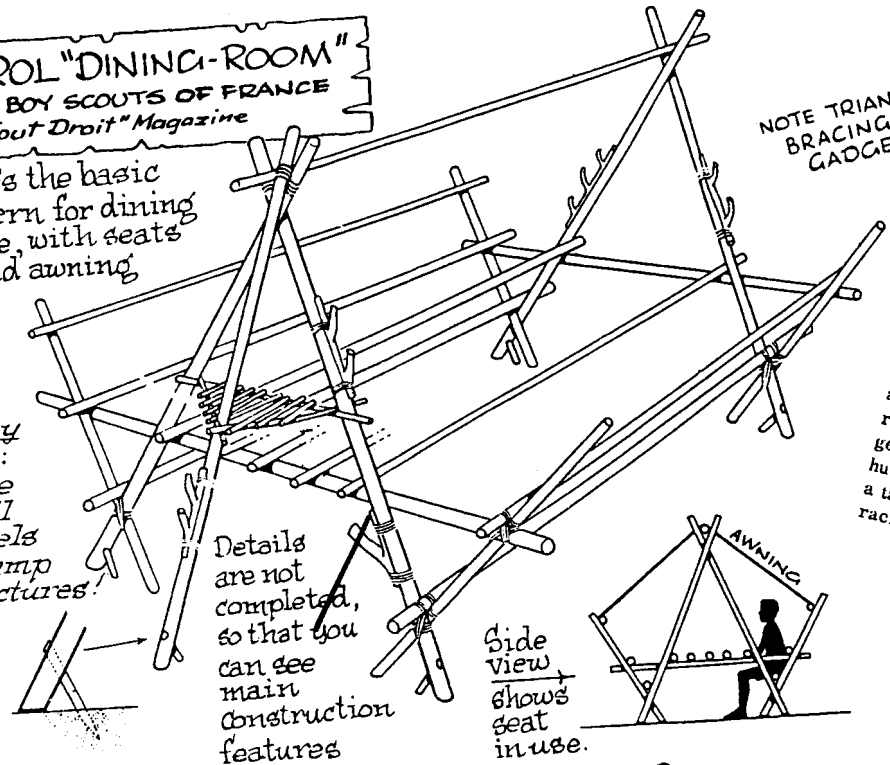

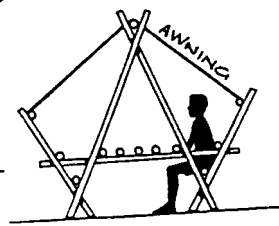
Here's the basic pattern for dining table, with seats and awning

 Make small models of camp structures!

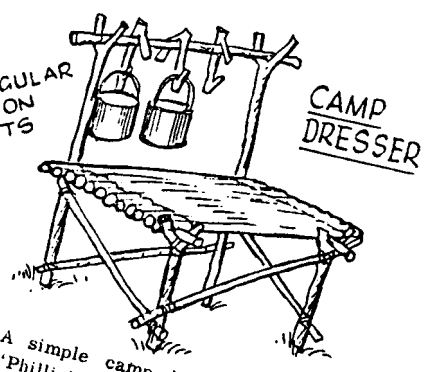


Details are not completed, so that you can see main construction features

NOTE TRIANGULAR BRACING ON GADGETS

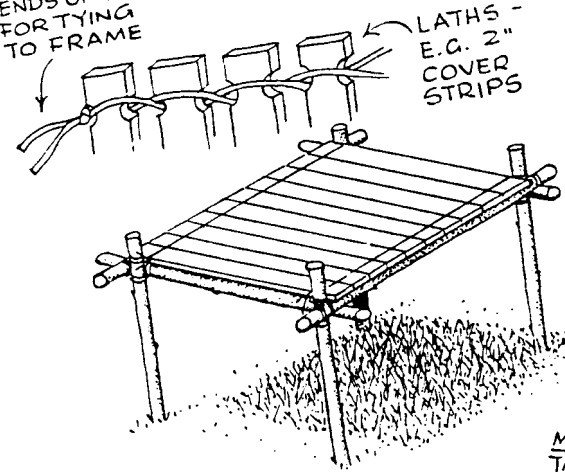


CAMP DRESSER

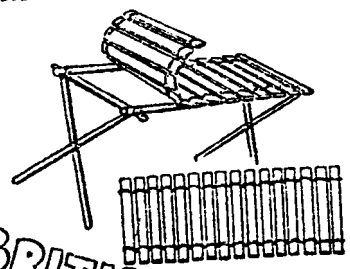

 MAKE PORTABLE, ROLL-UP TABLETOPS - WITH LATHS WOVEN TOGETHER WITH CORD.

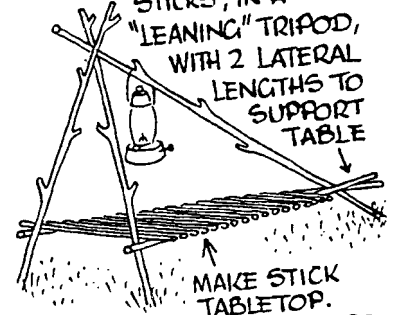


"TAFELBERG" PATROL KITCHENETTE

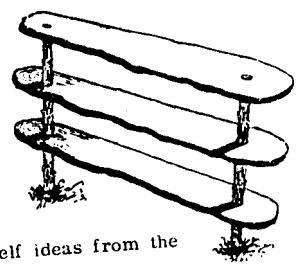
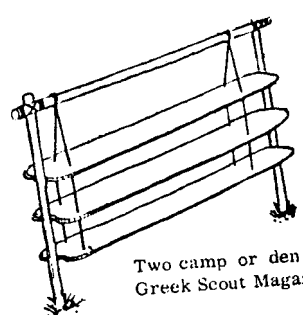
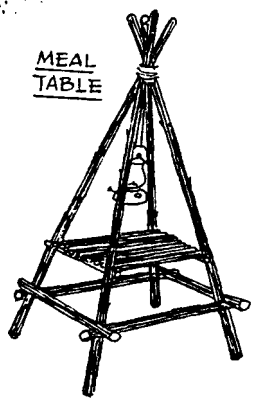
LASH 3 WELL-PRONGED STICKS, IN A "LEANING" TRIPOD, WITH 2 LATERAL LENGTHS TO SUPPORT TABLE

PRONGS ON UPRIGHTS ARE YOUR UTENSIL HOOKS. REAR END OF TABLE CAN BE "TENTED" WITH GRASS OR LEAVES TO SHADE FOODS.



MEAL TABLE



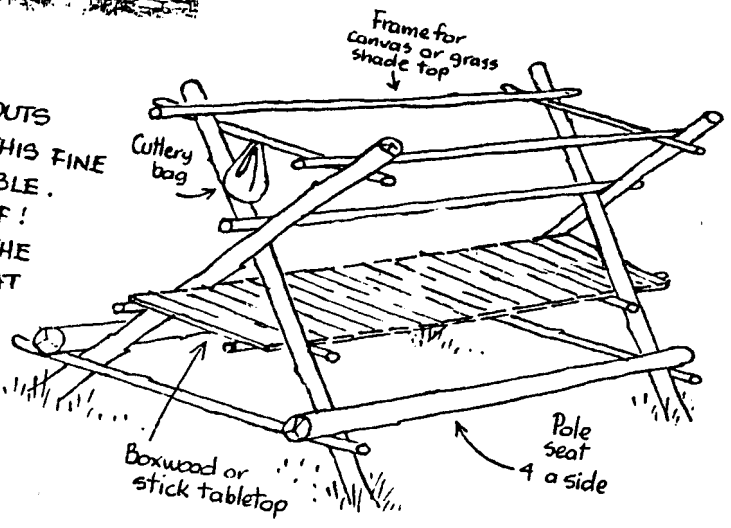
Two camp or den shelf ideas from the Greek Scout Magazine.

Tree stumps are handy. Turn them into stump tables, stump wash-stands, or stump fireplaces. For latter, cover top of stump with thick layer of rocks or mud. Use old stumps - never cut a tree specially. From Canada's "Scout Leader".
